

Erasmus Information Sheet on “Green” Travel Studies and Traineeships short-term

“Green” travel is being rewarded financially in the latest generation of the Erasmus Programme (2021–2027). You can have up to 6 additional travel days subsidized with the daily rate of your Erasmus grant (79,- € or 56,- €) and get a higher funding of your travel support based on the distance to your destination. For the calculation we use the [Erasmus Distance-Calculator](#). Starting point is Bonn.

Please see the comparison:

What counts as “green” travel?

Your travel is considered to be “green” if you use “green” means of transport (such as trains, buses and carsharing) for over 50% of the total distance you travel (outward and return journeys added together). The legs of your journey taken by plane, motorbike, ferry or car (if traveling alone) are considered “non-green.”

Update your Mobility-Online account no later than one month before you travel

We will need details of your travel in order to issue your Erasmus Grant Agreement. You should therefore provide these as soon as we have unlocked the step “Means of Travel” for you.

All participants are required to enter relevant information in their account regardless of whether or not they are planning any “green” travel. Either way, you will need to indicate the means of transport that you expect to take for the longest distance on your journey.

1. “Green” travel: yes/no

If you are planning a predominantly “green” journey, please check “Yes” for “Green Travel” in your Mobility-Online account, else check “No”.

You should check “Yes” even if you are not yet 100% sure that you will be able to go through with your plans. You will be able to amend your details after your stay if you ultimately did not undertake any “green” travel.

If you state before you set off that you will not be undertaking any “green” travel, however, you will not be able to change this answer—including after the end of your stay—even if you end up doing so after all.

2. Selection of means of transport

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Please select from the dropdown menu the means of transport that you will be taking for the longest distance overall. Unfortunately, you cannot make multiple selections.

“Green” travel: yes

You can choose bus, carsharing (two or more people in the car), bicycle, train or “other sustainable means of transport.”

“Green” travel: no

You can choose car/motorcycle, plane or ferry.

3. Calculating additional days’ travel

Funding is available for up to six additional days’ travel. Each calendar day that you travel completely “green” on your outward and/or return journey counts as 1 travel day. Each calendar day is counted, not the duration of the journey in hours.

Examples

- Paris: outward and return journey by train on one calendar day each = 2 additional funded travel days.
- Barcelona: outward journey with stopover and overnight stay in Toulouse, therefore on two calendar days; return journey on one calendar day = 3 additional funded travel days
- Prague: “Green” outward journey on one day; on the return journey, only a small part of the route travelled by green means of transport, e.g. only the journey to the airport or only the journey home from the airport in Germany = 1 additional funded travel day.
- If you travel by night train or Flixbus on one day and arrive the next, this counts as two travel days.

Please provide realistic information. For example, if you state that you need 6 days to travel to and from Paris by train, we will ask you to explain your travel plans in detail before we grant you the extra funding.

Only “green” travel days on the outward and return journey can be additionally funded, but no “green” trips during the stay.

4. Proof of “green” travel

After you have indicated in Mobility-Online that you are planning “green” travel, you will be able to download a sworn statement from your account. By signing this statement, you confirm your intention to use “green” means of transport for over 50% of your total journey. Upload the signed statement directly to your account. We cannot issue the Grant Agreement for your stay or pay you any money before then.

You will not need to show us proof of your journey(s) immediately (tickets or, if you are carsharing, gas station receipts, with photos if required) or upload it to your account.

However, you must retain these records of your journey for five years. The Erasmus National Agency will be asking us to request pieces of evidence from you by way of spot checks.

If you are then unable to supply any proof, you will be denied the additional funding.

If you do not end up traveling green after all, you can adjust the information again in Mobility-Online after your stay.

Competition “Green on the road”: prizes worth €1,000

In addition to your contribution to climate protection, the additional financial support and the certainly more exciting travel experience, you also have the chance to win a prize for “green” travel.

What do you have to do?

Write a report or make a video, audio, blog, a photo collage with explanations or what else you can think of as a creative contribution if you had an extraordinary or particularly eventful trip. Make people want to travel “green”, give

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them tips.

Specifications: maximum 3 pages of pure text, photos in addition; audio/video maximum length 90 seconds.

At a later date, we will provide you with a Sciebo link for uploading your contribution. The deadline for submission is expected to be 30/09/2025.

Ideally, of course, you should travel completely "green" on the outward and return journey, but this is not a prerequisite for participation. You are eligible to participate as soon as you meet the conditions for receiving the extra funding

for “green” travel days. In addition, a journey by ship/ ferry is also considered "green" for the competition.

Tips for your journey and more:

➤ **New Interrail Pass for Erasmus+**

There is now a new **Interrail Pass** especially for Erasmus participants, which is particularly attractive for semester stays as it includes 4 or 6 travel days within six months.

For a good €200, you can use 4 travel days flexibly within six months. Whether you travel to your destination and back on one day and then use 2 more days for other trips during your stay or whether you make stopovers on the outward and/or return journey, for example, is entirely up to you. For €300 you can "use" 6 travel days flexibly.

The more stopovers you make on the outward and/or return journey, the higher the additional Erasmus funding.
